

The SAT as Indiana's Accountability Assessment



Indiana's New High School Accountability Assessment

- The SAT will be administered as Indiana's statewide accountability test in grade 11.
- Performance level cut scores have yet to be determined by Indiana educators.



Graduation

- SAT results can also be used to fulfill Requirement Three in a student's chosen Graduation Pathway.
- Other options to fulfill this requirement remain valid for students who do not fulfill it with their SAT result.
- No specific score on the SAT is required to graduate high school with an Indiana diploma unless the student elects to pursue the SAT for graduation pathways.

Cost

- Students will participate in the Grade 11 SAT opportunity at no cost for the single test administration. Any retest or future opportunities will not be covered by state assessment funds.
- Each grade 11 student will be able to designate four colleges, universities, or other appropriate post-secondary institutions to receive a score report at no additional expense.



Testing Schedule

- The SAT will be administered in Spring to all grade 11 students during a statewide testing window (dates TBD).
- The PSAT will continue to be administered in the Fall to grade 10 students.



Format

- The SAT will be administered primarily online, though paper exams will be as an accommodation when needed.

INDIANA'S TRANSITION TO THE SAT



Starting Spring 2022, Indiana juniors will take College Board's SAT, which serves as Indiana's accountability assessment for Mathematics and English/Language Arts (ELA) in high school. The tests will be administered at Indiana high schools during the school day.

*SAT school day testing is not offered on Monday, April 18, 2022.

Following the first administration in Spring 2022, Indiana educators will set cut scores to determine proficiency levels for school accountability.

The SAT is not a graduation requirement, though students may use it as they work towards the Postsecondary Ready Competency requirement of their Graduation Pathway.

Aside from make-up tests, no retest opportunities for the SAT will be offered by the state. Students will receive one opportunity in spring of their junior year. Local schools may support students by offering additional test opportunities for Graduation Pathways purposes if desired, but these opportunities will not be funded by the state. Students who have previously taken the SAT will be expected to participate in the statewide assessment.
